

CampSafe Survey Results Summer 2025

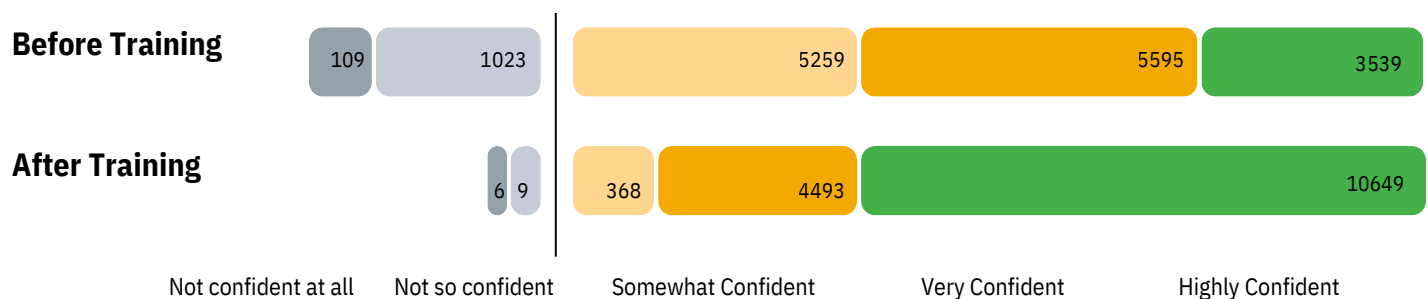


The **CampSafe child sexual abuse prevention training** continues to demonstrate a powerful impact on camp staff knowledge, awareness, and confidence in recognizing and responding to risks of abuse. The 2025 post-training survey reflects substantial improvements across all core competencies, confirming the program's effectiveness in enhancing safety culture within camps. Responses based on **15,525 participants**.

Increased Confidence in Identifying Risk

- Before Training: Average score 3.736
- After Training: Average score 4.66

Participants showed a significant improvement (average global increase of **8.396 points**), indicating that staff left the training far more capable of identifying campers at risk for abuse.

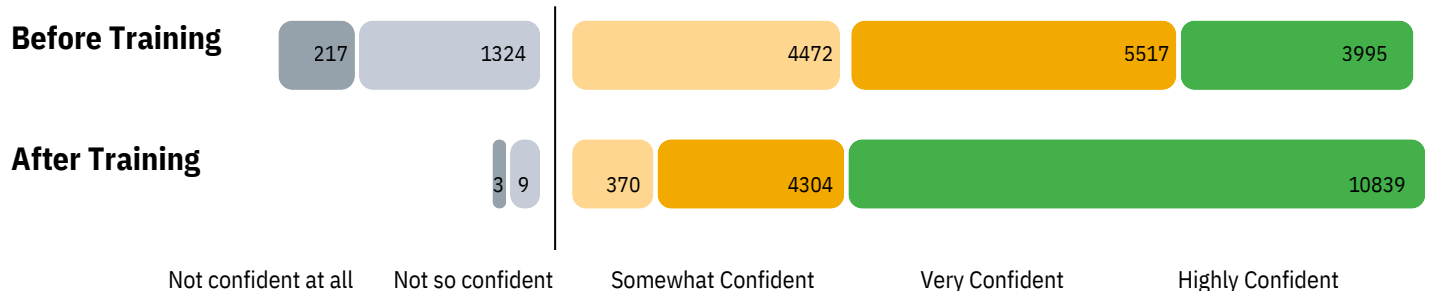

Confidence in Recognizing Signs of Grooming

- Before Training: Average score 3.757
- After Training: Average score 4.673

This represents an **8.429-point increase**, showing that staff became markedly more confident in spotting grooming behaviors—a crucial step in early intervention.

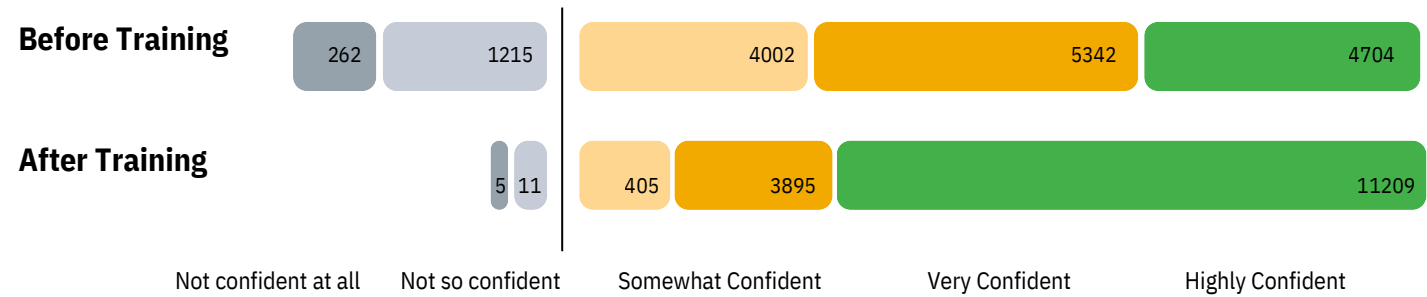

Confidence in Supporting a Camper Who Discloses Abuse

- Before Training: Average score 3.838
- After Training: Average score 4.694

Confidence increased by **8.532 points**, highlighting improved preparedness among staff to respond appropriately and sensitively to disclosures.

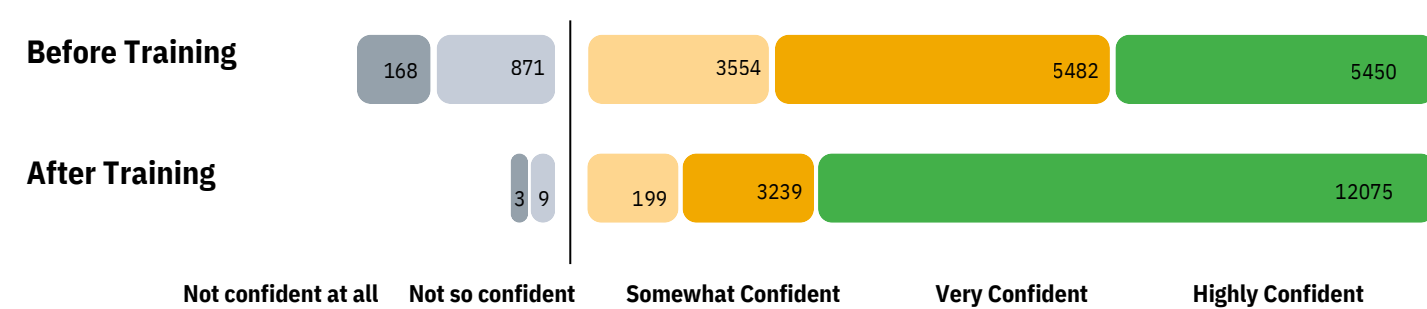

Confidence in Reporting Suspected Abuse

- Before Training: Average score 3.977
- After Training: Average score 4.763

The **8.741-point gain** demonstrates that participants now have a stronger understanding of mandated reporting procedures and their role in ensuring camper safety.

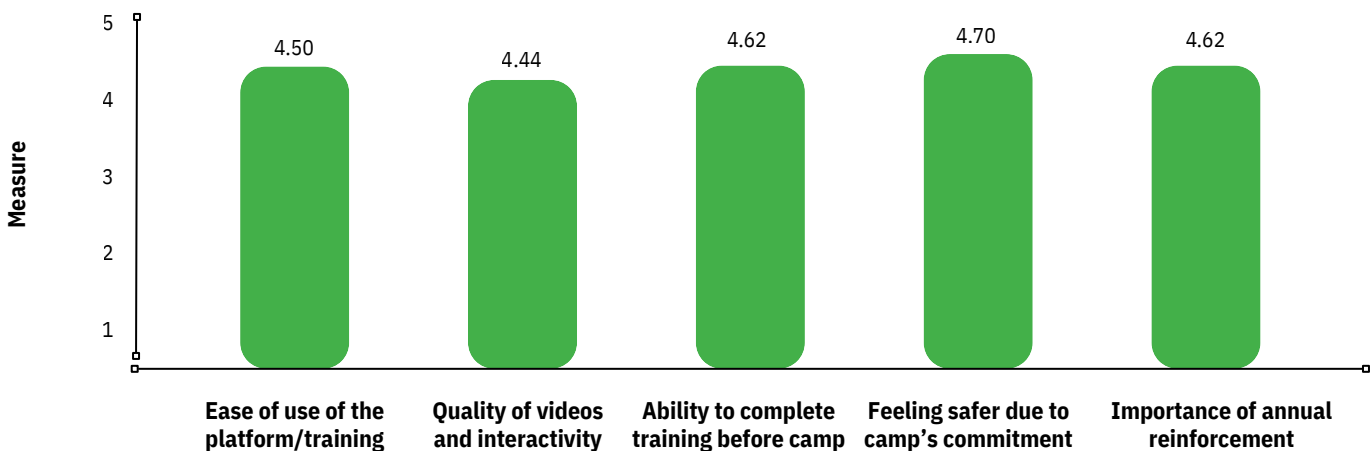
CampSafe Training Experience and Perceived Value

Staff reported consistently high satisfaction with the CampSafe training across all experience measures. Ratings highlight the program's ease of use, engaging content, and its role in reinforcing a culture of safety and prevention within camps.

99.5% share that they appreciate being able to take this training before they arrive at camp.

99.7% report feeling safer that their camp is taking action to protect the staff and campers.

99% report the importance of the annual reinforcement of this training.
